



## **Exploring Barriers to Childcare in Nashville**

In Nashville, 34% (44,880) of children are under 5, and many lack access to high-quality care. Childcare deserts, increasing costs, significant range in quality, and staffing struggles all contribute to families' struggles with childcare in Nashville.

located in the north and southeast of






The average childcare costs for infants in Nashville is higher than the average college tuition.
